Graduation Rates

The items in this section correspond to data elements collected by the National Center for Education Statistics' annual IPEDS reports.

Of the initial 2010 cohort, the total number who did not persist and did not graduate for the following reasons: death, permanent disability, service in the armed forces, foreign aid service of the federal government, or official church missions:	0
