PROOF OF ILLINOIS RESIDENCY

Illinois Student Assistance Commission required that Monetary Award Program (MAP) and Minority Teachers of Illinois (MTI) recipients be verified for Illinois residency. All documents submitted must have an Illinois address.

For a **DEPENDENT** student (**required to provide parent information on the FAFSA**), a dependent student's parent must physically reside within Illinois and Illinois must be your parents' true, fixed permanent home. Refer to the list below for acceptable documents to verify your parents' Illinois residency status.

For an **INDEPENDENT** student, the documentation must indicate that the student resided in Illinois for the relevant 12 continuous, full months prior to the beginning of the school's academic year. The institution may choose to request documents that are in addition to, or instead of, those listed below:

Acceptable Documents (Only submit one):

- Parent's (or student's, if independent) valid State of Illinois income tax return or federal tax transcript;
- Illinois high school or Illinois college transcript;
- State of Illinois Driver's License;
- Utility or rent bills in the applicant's (or parent's) name;
- Illinois auto registration card;
- Wage and tax statements (IRS Form W-2);
- Statement of benefits history from the Illinois Department of Healthcare and Family Services;
- Residential lease in the applicant's (or parent's) name;
- Statement of benefits from the Illinois Department of Employment Security;
- State of Illinois Identification Card issued by the Secretary of State;
- Statement of benefits from the Social Security Administration;
- Illinois voter's registration card;
- Property tax bill; or
- IRS Form 1099-Miscellaneous Income Statements.

NOTE: If a student is a resident of Illinois, but the institution cannot determine this fact, the student or the institution may verify residency through ISAC's appeal process.
